REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE,  
(Chapter 280).

UNDER SECTION 103 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 1 OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1961, and shall be construed and read as one with the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations\*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 71 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended —

- (a) by the renumbering of the regulation as regulation 71(i); and
- (b) by the insertion thereafter of the following paragraph —

“(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation, the Licensing Authority may, in his discretion, in any particular case approve of the overall width of a motor lorry being in excess of 7 feet 6 inches, subject to such conditions as he may think fit.”
