Made Under

THE FIRE PREVENTION ORDINANCE, 1954
(No. 19 of 1954).

UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FIRE PREVENTION ORDINANCE, 1954, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Welding Shops (Amendment) Regulations, 1962, and shall be read and construed with the Welding Shops Regulations, 1958*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Paragraph (b) of regulation 13 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“(b) The walls and ceiling shall be constructed of or lined with fire resisting material to the satisfaction of the Chief Fire Officer.
All supports, beams and pillars shall be constructed of or lined with fire resisting material to a height of not less than ten feet from the floor level to the satisfaction of the Chief Fire Officer.”

3. Regulation 15 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“15. No registered welding shop shall be situated in or under any building which consists wholly or in part of an hotel, a boarding and lodging house, or tenement.”
