THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE DIRECTOR OF POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Money Order (Amendment) Regulations, 1962, and shall be construed and read as one with the Post Office Money Order *Regulations hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the symbol and figures "\$100" appearing in the third line thereof of the symbol and figures "\$250".

3. Regulations 13 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the symbol and figures "\$250" of the symbol and figures "\$2,000."
