BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 — 1963

UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS
IN COUNCIL 1939—1963, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXER-
CISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF,
I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers ^{Citation.}
(Amendment) (No. 10) Regulations, 1964 and shall be construed and
read with the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964, and any Regulations
amending the same.

2. Regulation 44 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964 ^{Amendment}
is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of paragraph (3) and the ^{of Regula-}
substitution therefor of the following paragraph — ^{tion 44.}

“ (3) No person shall be detained under the powers con-
ferred by this regulation for a period exceeding twenty-
four hours except with the authority of a magistrate or
of a police officer not below the rank of Assistant
Superintendent on either of whose direction such person
may be detained for a further period of twenty-four
hours:

Provided, however, that if a magistrate is satisfied
that the necessary inquiries cannot be completed within
such further period of twenty-four hours, such magis-
trate may direct such person to be detained for an
additional further period not exceeding six days. ”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate
their general purport)

The effect of these regulations is that in future only magistrates will
have power to authorise the detention in custody of persons arrested
under the Emergency Powers Regulations 1964 for periods in excess
of forty-eight hours.
