THE CUSTOMS ACT

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 275 OF THE CUSTOMS ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

1. These Regulations, which amend the Customs Regulations*, may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Regulations 1984. Citation.
2. Regulation 84 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "or C. 15, as the case may be,". Amendment of regulation 84.
3. Schedule B to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows — Amendment of Schedule B to the Principal Regulations.
 - (a) by the deletion from the Index of Forms of the entry "15 International passenger baggage declaration ...84";
 - (b) by the revocation of Form C. 14 and the substitution therefor of the Form in the Schedule hereto as Form C. 14;

- (c) in the "Instructions On Completing This Form" appended to Form C. 14A, by the substitution in paragraph 4 under the heading "Outgoing Passengers (residents and Non-Residents)", for the words "six hundred dollars (G\$600.00)", "four hundred dollars (G\$400.00)" and "two hundred (G\$200.00)", of the words "two thousand dollars (G\$2,000.00)", "one thousand and five hundred dollars (G\$1,500.00)" and "five hundred dollars (G\$500.00)" respectively; and
- (d) by the deletion of Form C. 15.

INSTRUCTIONS ON COMPLETING THIS FORM

The laws of Guyana require that incoming passengers declare the articles they acquire abroad (whether worn or used, whether dutiable or not, and whether obtained by purchase, as gifts, or otherwise) which are in their possession at the time of arrival. Any repairs done abroad must also be declared.

Oral declarations may be made by incoming passengers providing the total price of articles declared (price actually paid or if not purchased, fair retail price in country where obtained) do not exceed G \$1,000.

If the value exceeds G \$1,000 then the incoming passengers must list in writing on this side of this form all articles and repairs acquired and done abroad which they are now bringing through Customs.

All baggage of passengers (including handbags and hand-carried parcels) may be examined. Any false declaration made to a proper officer is punishable by law.
