THE PUBLIC SERVICE APPELLATE TRIBUNAL ACT 1984

(Act No. 17 of 1984)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION
34 OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE APPELLATE TRIBUNAL ACT 1984,
I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Service Appellate Tribunal (Terms and Conditions of Appointment of Members) Regulations 1987.

Terms and conditions of appointment of members.

2. (1) (a) The Chairman shall be paid the salary and allowances of a Justice of Appeal:

Provided that where any person appointed as Chairman is in receipt of a pension or any other remuneration from the Consolidated Fund or from moneys of a local democratic organ his salary and allowances as chairman shall be modified in such a manner so that the aggregate of such salary and allowances and the amount of such pension and remuneration for any month shall not exceed the aggregate of the salary and allowances of —

(i) if before appointment as chairman he held the office of Chancellor or Chief Justice, the Chancellor or Chief Justice, as the case may be:

(ii) in any other case, a Justice of Appeal.

(b) The other terms and conditions of appointment of the chairman shall be the same as those of a Justice of Appeal.

(2) The terms and conditions of appointment of a member appointed under section 11 (1) (a) of the Act, including salary and allowances, shall be the same as those of the Chairman of the Public Service Commission:

Provided that where any person appointed as such member is in receipt of a pension or any other remuneration from the Consolidated Fund or from moneys of a Local Democratic Organ his salary and allowances as such member shall be modified in such a manner so that the aggregate of such salary and allowances and such amount of pension and remuneration for any month shall not exceed the aggregate of the salary and allowances of the Chairman of the Public Service Commission.

(3) The member appointed under Section 11 (1) (b) of the Act shall be paid an allowance of two hundred dollars for each day's attendance in respect of each sitting of the tribunal, a telephone allowance of fifty dollars per month and the actual expenses incurred in travelling for attending to the business of the Tribunal:

Provided that the total allowance paid to such member for attendance in any month in respect of sittings of the Tribunal, shall not be less than one thousand dollars.
