RESOLUTION No. LXIII.

THAT, with reference to Governor's Message No. 17 of 1930, and the Combined Court Resolution No. XIV. of the 15th day of April, 1924, this Council approves of subordinate Government employees not on the Fixed Establishment who have served the Colony faithfully for periods under 20 years being paid compassionate gratuities on the following scale, payment to be made by monthly instalments over a period of one year, except where the Governor is satisfied on representations made to him that a single payment will be of more advantage to the recipient :--

15 years service and over	...	three times \$120.
10 years service and over	...	twice \$120.
5 years service and over	...	\$120.
Under 5 years service	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ of \$120 per complete year.

These gratuities will be payable only in cases where the services of the employee have been continuous. For this purpose service will be regarded as continuous where service is not broken by cessation of employment for more than fourteen working days in any one year; provided that the Governor-in-Council may in his discretion allow in any case a broken period as aforesaid of more than fourteen days.

In case of the death of the employee the Governor-in-Council may in his discretion grant to the next-of-kin such gratuity as he may think fit.
