SAINT PETER'S TEMPLE (INCORPORATION OF TRUSTEES) BILL 1977

## A BILL

## Intituled

AN ACT to incorporate the Board of Trustees of the Saint Peter's Temple in Guyana and for purposes connected therewith.

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:—

- Short title.** 1. This Act may be cited as the Saint Peter's Temple in Guyana (Incorporation of Trustees) Act 1977.
- Interpre-  
tation.** 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —  
 “the Board of Trustees” or “the Board” means the Board of Trustees of the Church;  
 “the Church” means the Saint Peter's Temple in Guyana;  
 “the Parent Church” means the Saint Michael's Temple of 1571 Carroll Street, Brooklyn, New York, 11213, United States of America.
- Incorporation of the  
Board of  
Trustees.** 3. Bishop Lucille Cort of the Parent Church, President, Benjamin George, Vice President, Jean Alleyne, Secretary, Nellie Kendall, Assistant Secretary and Eustace Holder, Treasurer, of the Church, and their successors in office shall have the name of the Board of Trustees of the Saint Peter's Temple in Guyana and shall be a body corporate.

Trustee.** 4. There shall not be at any time more than five Trustees of the Board and in the event of the death or absence of any Trustee from Guyana or the inability or refusal of any one or more of the Trustees to act as such, all or any of the powers conferred by this Act on the Trustees may be exercised by the surviving or remaining Trustees, provided that in any case their number shall not be less than three.

Board.** 5. All property movable or immovable of whatever nature or kind hereafter bequeathed by will or otherwise given to the Church shall be deemed to be the property of the Board.
- Tenure of

for use  
and benefit

Church.** 6. All property vested in or hereafter acquired by the Board shall be held by the Board for the use and benefit of the Church.

7. In all matters not specifically provided for by this Act, the Board shall, so far as may be practicable, possess and exercised the like power and authority as are possessed and exercised by the Parent Church, and its proceedings shall be governed by the laws, regulations, powers and practices of the Parent Church in so far as they are not inconsistent with any law in force in Guyana.

8. A statement that any person named therein is a member of the Board of Trustees purporting to be signed by the President or the Vice President or the Secretary of the Church shall be prima facie evidence of the said fact.

9. All process which is required to be served on the Board shall be deemed to be sufficiently served if served at the residence in Guyana of any of the members of the Board or if a copy thereof is published in the Gazette.
