Intituled

AN ORDINANCE TO ALLOW AND CONFIRM CERTAIN ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE INCURRED IN THE YEAR ENDED ON THE 31ST DECEMBER, 1956.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1956) Ordinance, 1958.

Short title.

2. The expenditure during the year ended on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, to the amount of one million seven hundred and sixty-seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight dollars and ninety-two cents on certain services set forth in the schedule to this Ordinance and not provided for, or not fully provided for, by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1956, is hereby allowed and confirmed.

OBJECTS AND REASONS
