GEORGETOWN TOWN COUNCIL (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1964.

Arrangement of Sections.

2. Insertion of section 189A in Chapter 152.
3. Amendment of section 193 of Chapter 152.

A BILL

Intituled

An Ordinance to amend the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1964.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Town Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964, and shall be construed and read as one with the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance and any Ordinance amending the same. Short title. Cap. 152.

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 189 of the following section — Insertion of section 189A in Chapter 152.

“Receiving and delivering strays.”

189A.(1) The pound keeper, or someone appointed by the Council as his deputy shall constantly be at hand at all times to receive all strays, and in default thereof, the pound keeper or his deputy, as the case may be, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars for each time he or his deputy is so absent.

(2) The pound keeper, or someone appointed by the Council as his deputy, shall constantly be at hand between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening to deliver all strays, and in default thereof shall be subject to the penalty prescribed for a default in the preceding subsection.”

3. Section 193 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after the word “sections” of the figures and comma “15.” Amendment of section 193 of Chapter 152.

## OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the provisions of section 15 of the Pounds Ordinance, Chapter 82, strays may be received at any pound only between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening. The purpose of this Bill is to enable the pound in Georgetown to be kept open at all times so that animals found straying in Georgetown during the night may be impounded immediately.
