This Bill seeks to amend the Rice (Regulation of Manufacturing and Marketing) Act 1985 (Act No. 1 of 1985) so as to increase the total number of the members of the National Padi and Rice Grading Centre, the Guyana Rice Milling and Marketing Authority and the Guyana Rice Export Board by two and that of a regional padi and rice grading committee and a Regional Rice Milling and Marketing Authority by one.
