PART 1

• GENERAL

This report covers the period 1st January to 31st December, 1961, during which time the Force was commanded by Lt. Colonel C.L. deFreitas, E.D.

TRAINING

The training period commenced on 9th February and ended on 12th November.

- (a) The following pre-Camp Training was carried out during period 6th July to 14th September, 1961:
 - (i) Route March.
 - (ii) Officers Tactical Cadre on Signal Training.
 - (iii) Warrant Officers and Sergeant's Cadre on Map Reading.
 - (iw) Junior N.C.O's Tactical Cadre.

- (b) Recruit Training commenced on 6th March, and ended at Camp with a passing out Parade.

(c) CAMP

The Annual Training Camp was held at "Haywood Camp", Tacama, from 16th to 30th September. A Total of 430 Officers and men attended, also 2 Officers and one Platoon The Royal Hampshire Regiment.
