 - "(2) A prosecutor shall initiate or participate in a plea discussion or conclude a plea agreement where-
 - (a) The accused person or suspect;
 - (b) Any person or company that holds assets, or an interest in assets, on behalf of the accused person or suspect; or
 - (c) Any property held by the accused person or suspect, may be precluded from being the subject of a pecuniary penalty order, forfeiture order or civil forfeiture order, as the case may be.""

Clause 8 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 9 to 38 were passed as printed.

The Schedule was passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.
