

NOTICE

THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE
(Chapter 5)

UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR ON THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1964, DEPUTED THE MINISTER FOR THE TIME BEING CHARGED WITH RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE POSTAL SERVICES TO EXERCISE ON HIS BEHALF THE POWERS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST COLUMN OF THE SCHEDULE HEREUNDER CONFERRED ON THE GOVERNOR BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 132, MENTIONED IN THE SECOND COLUMN OF THE SAID SCHEDULE, SUBJECT HOWEVER TO THE QUALIFICATION THAT THE DELEGATION OF POWERS MENTIONED HEREIN SHALL REMAIN IN FORCE UNTIL VARIED OR REVOKED BY THE GOVERNOR:—

SCHEDULE

Powers Delegated	Provisions of the Post and Telegraph Ordinance
1. To license or consent to the transmission of telegrams from one place to another within the Colony, on any terms and conditions the Governor thinks fit and the performance of all the incidental services of receiving, collecting, sending, despatching and delivering telegrams.	Section 12 (1) (c).
2. To cause to be provided stamped envelopes, stamped wrappers, letter-sheet envelopes and envelopes for registered postal matter and postal cards of all kinds.	Section 25.
3. To authorise the insertion in a postal packet of any substance or narcotic (referred to in paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 29) according to any convention or agreement of the Universal Postal Union.	Section 29 (1) (d).
4. To reverse or modify the decision of the Director of Posts and Telecommunications on the application of any person interested where any question arises whether any postal packet is a letter, post card, newspaper, supplement, book packet, circular, or other description of postal packet within the meaning of the Post and Telegraph Ordinance or the regulations made thereunder.	Section 34.

5. To approve of the Director of Posts and Telecommunications providing for the remission of small sums of money through the post office by means of money orders, and demanding and receiving, for the public use of the Colony, in respect of those money orders the rates of commission fixed therefor.

6. To appoint an officer to be a wireless telegraphy inspector for the purpose of inspecting ships in order to ascertain whether the requirements of section 64 of the Post and Telegraph Ordinance relating to wireless telegraphy are observed on board any ship.
