THE NATIONAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL SECURITY ACT, 1969
(No. 15 of 1969)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED ON ME BY SECTION 51
OF THE NATIONAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL SECURITY ACT,
1969, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Insurance and Social Security (Industrial Benefit Medical Care) (Amendment) Regulations, 1971 and shall be construed and read as one with the National Insurance and Social Security (Industrial Benefit Medical Care) Regulations, 1969, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 12 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects—

- (a) by inserting the words “and other” after the word “Travelling” in the marginal reference to the regulation;
- (b) by renumbering the regulation as regulation 12(1);
- (c) by adding the following paragraph as paragraph (2) of regulation 12—

“(2) The Board may, in addition to the amount paid to an injured person pursuant to paragraph (1), pay to him subsistence allowance at such rate as may be determined by the Board, and an allowance for loss of pay equivalent to one day’s injury benefit for each day on which he is absent from work on account of treatment for the industrial injury.”
