REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF THE IMPORTATION OF TEXTILES (QUOTAS) ORDINANCE, 1934.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Textiles (Quotas) Regulations, 1937. Short title.
2. A return of the quantity, class and origin of any regulated textiles imported shall be made upon the appropriate import entry form. Return of regulated textiles imported.
3. A certificate of origin of any regulated textiles imported shall be in Form 1 in the schedule to these regulations. Certificate of origin of regulated textiles.
- 4.—(1) In the case of textiles of United Kingdom manufacture of a class in respect of which a quota has been fixed the Comptroller of Customs shall require the production of a certificate of origin— Certificate of origin of United Kingdom textiles.
 - (a) where the value of the consignment does not exceed five pounds sterling, in Form 2 in the schedule duly stamped with the stamp of the certifying authority ;
 - (b) where the value of the consignment exceeds five pounds sterling, in Form 3 in the schedule duly endorsed by an approved Chamber of Commerce in Form 4 or by the Federation of British Industries (Incorporated by Royal Charter) in Form 5 in the schedule.

(2) The Comptroller of Customs shall publish in the *Gazette* the names of those Chambers of Commerce in the United Kingdom whose endorsements he will accept.

Certificate of origin of Hong Kong textiles.

5. In the case of textiles of Hong Kong manufacture of a class in respect of which a quota has been fixed the Comptroller of Customs shall require the production of a certificate of origin in Form 3 in the schedule duly endorsed by the Superintendent of Imports and Exports, Hong Kong, in Form 6 in the schedule.

Certificate of origin of other British Empire textiles.

6. In the case of textiles of British Empire manufacture other than the United Kingdom and Hong Kong of a class in respect of which a quota has been fixed the Comptroller of Customs shall require the production of the certificate of origin set out in Schedule "B" to the British Preferential Tariff (No. 2) Order dated 1st November, 1933.

Payment of fee for statement.

7. On payment of a fee of one shilling the Comptroller of Customs may furnish to any person a statement of the total quantity of regulated textiles already imported from any individual foreign country during any quota period.

Fee for licence.

8. There shall be paid a fee of one shilling for every licence to import regulated textiles which is issued by the Comptroller of Customs.

Commencement.

9. These regulations shall come into effect on the fifteenth day of August, 1937 :

Provided that regulation 5 shall not take effect in respect to textiles shipped from Hong Kong before the seventh day of July, 1937, or of any textiles shipped from Hong Kong upon any subsequent date in the months of July, August, September and October, 1937, if accompanied by a certificate from the Superintendent of Imports and Exports, Hong Kong, that such textiles were ordered before the seventh day of July, 1937.

Repeal.

10. The Textile (Quotas) Regulations (No. 2), 1936, are hereby revoked.
