REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SUBSECTIONS (1) AND (2) (D) OF SECTION 1 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939, AS EXTENDED TO THE COLONY BY THE EMERGENCY POWERS (COLONIAL DEFENCE) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1939.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Importation of Textiles (Suspension of Quotas) Regulations, 1939.

2. I hereby suspend from operation—

(a) the Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Ordinance, 1934, and all Ordinances amending the said Ordinance; and

(b) the Textiles (Quotas) Regulations, 1937, and all Regulations amending the said Regulations.

3. Textiles containing fifty *per centum* or more, by weight, of cotton or of artificial silk or of cotton and of artificial silk combined shall only be imported into the Colony from the United Kingdom:—

(a) if the value of the consignment does not exceed five pounds sterling, on production to the Comptroller of Customs of a return and declaration, duly completed, in the form set out as form A in the Schedule hereto; or

(b) if the value of the consignment exceeds five pounds sterling, on production to the Comptroller of Customs of a return and declaration, duly completed, in the form set out as form B in the Schedule hereto and carrying either (i) an endorsement of the Federation of British Industries (incorporated by Royal Charter) in the form set out as form C in the Schedule hereto or (ii) an endorsement of an approved Chamber of Commerce in the form set out as form D in the Schedule hereto.

4. Textiles containing fifty *per centum* or more, by weight, of cotton or of artificial silk or of cotton and of artificial silk combined shall only be imported into the Colony from Hong Kong on the production of a return and declaration, duly completed, in the form set out as form B in the Schedule hereto and carrying an endorsement in the form set out as form E in the Schedule hereto.

5. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st January, 1940.
