Made under

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE
(Chapter 145)

UNDER SECTIONS 141 AND 157 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE PRESIDENT :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Buildings) (Amendment) Regulations 1972 and shall be construed and read as one with the Public Health (Buildings) Regulations No. 13 of 1950 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations and any Regulations amending the same.

2. No building shall be erected less than four feet from the boundaries of any lot, such distance being measured in every case from the nearest part of such building including the stairway or steps, or any projections or attachments thereto, exclusive of the roof, which shall not be less than two feet from the boundary.

3. Provided that where two or more contiguous lots are owned by the same persons and the owner desires to combine two or more such contiguous lots for the purpose of erecting any building thereon this regulation shall not apply to the boundaries between such contiguous lots.
