

BRITISH GUIANA.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE PETROLEUM ORDINANCE, 1930,
(No. 7 of 1930).

UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE PETROLEUM ORDINANCE, 1930, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Petroleum (Amendment) Regulations, 1947, and shall be construed with the Petroleum Regulations, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "to oil fuel when electric light is exclusively used for illumination nor" therein appearing.

3. Regulation 7 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso thereto—
"Provided that this regulation shall not apply to dangerous petroleum when introduced into the Colony stored in bulk within a vessel."

4. Regulation 8 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation is substituted therefor—

"Importation of petroleum in bulk.

8. Receipt and discharge of petroleum stored in bulk within a vessel shall be effected by pipeline only and shall be subject to any directions issued by the Harbour Master, or any other officer appointed by the Governor in that behalf, either generally or in respect of any particular vessel."

5. Regulation 14 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution of the words "Director of Public Works" for the words "Colonial Secretary" therein appearing.

6. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended by the substitution of the words "Director of Public Works" for the word "Governor" wherever that word occurs in regulations 15, 18 and 20 thereof.

7. Sub-regulation (2) of regulation 29 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked.
