

BRITISH GUIANA.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE EXPLOSIVES ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 74).

UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE EXPLOSIVES ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS ARE HEREBY MADE BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Explosives (Amendment) Regulations, 1947, and shall be construed with the Explosives Regulations, 1905 (which are published in the *Gazette* of the 15th day of November, 1905, at page 1080), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended—

(a) by re-numbering the regulation as sub-regulation (1);

(b) by the addition of the following as sub-regulations (2) and (3)—

“(2) Anything to the contrary contained in sub-regulation (1) of this regulation notwithstanding, any ship entering the Harbour of Georgetown with explosives consigned to the Demerara Bauxite Company, Limited, at Mackenzie, Demerara River, may proceed up the Demerara River as far as Mackenzie without discharging the said explosives at Georgetown.

(3) No ship carrying explosives shall go alongside any wharf or stelling.”

3. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion, after regulation 11, of the following new regulation—

“11A. The provisions of regulations 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of these Regulations shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply—

(a) to any ship carrying explosives up the Demerara River; and

(b) to any boat, punt or other vessel used to discharge explosives from any ship in the Demerara River.”
