MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,

(No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER REGULATION 36 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Movement of Equines) Regulations, 1953.

2. (1) No person shall move, take or carry any horse, ass or mule from the area described in the Schedule hereto to any other part of the Colony.

(2) Any person who commits a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

SCHEDULE

(Description of Area).

That area, bounded on the North by the Atlantic Ocean, on the East by the Courantyne River, on the South by the line of latitude 5°N, and on the West by the Berbice River.
