Made Under

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE
POSTMASTER GENERAL WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOV-
ERNOR IN COUNCIL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parcel Post (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Parcel Post Regulations *, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (a) in the table of postage rates of the paragraph which appears in the schedule to these Regulations.

and in addition thereto the credits applicable to the Post Office of Great Britain on parcels in each of the above scales of weight for the particular destination.
