

BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Official Inland Correspondence (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Official Inland Correspondence Regulations, 1955* hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 13 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

‘Failure to comply with method of franking.’ 13. Letters and packets which do not comply with the requirements of these Regulations as regards the method of franking will be delivered as addressed, provided it is clear from the form of address that they are sent on official business.”

3. Paragraph (1) of regulation 14 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“Registration fee on registered matter.” 14. (1) Official postal matter forwarded by registration post shall have the registration fee prepaid, save and except —

- (a) postal matter containing cheques, money orders or postal orders, or in cases where the money order service is not available, cash remittances; or
- (b) postal matter containing a document which, by virtue of any Ordinance, rule or regulation, is required to be transmitted by registered post.”
