BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 280).

UNDER SECTION 103 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 1960, and shall be read and construed with the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 35 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“35. Every animal drawn vehicle on any road shall during the hours of darkness carry —

- (a) a lamp showing a white light visible from a reasonable distance to the front and from the rear of the vehicle fixed on the offside of the vehicle at a minimum height of five feet from the surface of the roadway so that no part of the vehicle or its equipment or load in any way obscures the visibility of the light;
- (b) a lamp showing to the rear a red light visible from a reasonable distance and so fixed that it shall be on the centre line or on the offside of the vehicle:

Provided that it shall be sufficient compliance with paragraph (b) of this Regulation if the vehicle has attached thereto in place of the light two unobscured and efficient red reflectors of a type approved by the Licensing Authority one each on the outer edges of the rear end of the vehicle.”
