REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE ELECTORAL PROVISIONS (REGISTRATION)
ORDINANCE, 1961.

(No. 10 of 1961).

UNDER SECTION 23 OF THE ELECTORAL PROVISIONS (REGISTRATION) ORDINANCE, 1961, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral Provisions (Registration) Regulations, 1961. Short title.

PART I — REMUNERATION AND TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES OF REGISTRATION OFFICERS

2. An electoral registrar shall be paid — Electoral registrar's remuneration.
- (a) for the performance of his functions in connection with the compilation of any register a sum of \$200.00 and, if the total number of persons listed in the preliminary lists transmitted to him under rule 5 of the Rules exceeds 7,500, an additional sum of \$2.00 for every hundred such persons in excess of 7,500;
 - (b) for the performance of his functions in connection with the revision of any register a sum calculated at the rate of \$5.00 for each polling division in his electoral district.
3. A deputy electoral registrar shall be paid a sum of \$100.00 for the performance of his functions in connection with the compilation of any register. Remuneration of deputy electoral registrar.
4. A registration officer appointed as clerical assistant to an electoral registrar shall be paid — Remuneration of clerical assistant.
- (a) for the performance of his functions in connection with the compilation of any register a sum of \$40.00;
 - (b) for the performance of his functions in connection with the revision of any register a sum of \$25.00.
5. A registration officer who types a copy of any preliminary list or part thereof, as required under rule 6 of the Rules, shall be paid at the rate of one cent for each entry therein comprising all particulars relating to any person. Typist's remuneration.

6. (1) An enumerator shall be paid for the performance of his functions in connection with the compilation of any register —

- (a) a sum of \$20.00, and a further sum calculated at the rate of five cents for each person listed in the part of such register for the enumerator's polling division, if the enumerator's polling division is classified as a built up area;
- (b) a sum of \$20.00, and a further sum calculated at the rate of eight cents for each person listed in the part of such register for the enumerator's polling division, if the enumerator's polling division is classified as a sparsely populated area; or
- (c) such sum not exceeding \$90.00 as the Chief Electoral Officer may determine, if the enumerator's polling division is classified as a remote area.

(2) The Chief Electoral Officer shall classify every polling division for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this regulation as he thinks fit.

(3) An enumerator shall, for travelling to receive instructions from an electoral registrar or deputy electoral registrar at any place and returning therefrom before commencing the enumeration, be paid —

- (a) an allowance of \$1.50 if the distance from such place to the place from which he travels as aforesaid is less than five miles; or
- (b) an allowance of \$2.50 if the said distance is five miles or more:

Provided that where the enumerator's polling division, or any part thereof, is in the North-West, Mazaruni-Potaro or Rupununi District, as declared under section 2 of the District Government Ordinance, the enumerator shall, for travelling and returning as aforesaid, be paid in lieu of any such allowance an allowance equal to the amount of such travelling expenses actually incurred by him as are certified by the Chief Electoral Officer to be reasonable for the purpose of journeying to and from the place where the instructions are received:

Provided further that no enumerator shall be paid allowances in respect of more than one journey in connection with the compilation of any register.

7. Electoral registrars and deputy electoral registrars shall, in respect of travelling in the course of their duties, be paid the following travelling allowances —

- (a) in the case of electoral registrars or deputy electoral registrars who are public officers otherwise entitled to travelling allowances, travelling allowances at the rates otherwise applicable to them as public officers;
- (b) in the case of electoral registrars or deputy electoral registrars who are not public officers otherwise entitled to travelling allowances —

- (i) where the electoral registrar or deputy electoral registrar uses his own motor car or motor cycle, travelling allowances at the appropriate "scale B" or motor cycle rate as the case may be prescribed for public officers;
- (ii) where the electoral registrar or deputy electoral registrar does not use his own motor car or motor cycle, such travelling expenses actually incurred by him as are certified by the Chief Electoral Officer to be reasonable.

PART II—PRINTING, DISTRIBUTION AND SALE OF COPIES OF REGISTERS.

8. There shall be printed such number of copies of each register compiled under the Electoral Provisions (Registration) Ordinance, 1961, as may be directed by the Chief Electoral Officer. Printing.

9. An election officer as defined by section 2 of the Ordinance, shall be furnished with such number of copies of any part of a register as may be approved by the Chief Electoral Officer for use in the performance of the election officer's duties. Distribution

10. Every candidate duly nominated for election under the Ordinance shall be entitled, free of charge, to one copy of the register for the electoral district in respect of which he is nominated. Distribution
to candidates.

11. Subject to the provisions of regulations 9 and 10 of these Regulations, copies of the part of a register relating to any polling division printed under regulation 8 of these Regulations shall be made available for sale to the public at the price of fifty cents per copy. Sale.
