REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE FIRE BRIGADE ORDINANCE, 1957.

(No. 7 of 1957).

UNDER SECTION 31 OF THE FIRE BRIGADE ORDINANCE, 1957, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fire Brigade (Fire Hydrants) Regulations, 1964.

2. Any person who obstructs any fire hydrant otherwise than in consequence of its use shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty-four dollars:

Provided that it shall not amount to an obstruction under these Regulations if a vehicle is in such a position that no part of the vehicle is within five feet of an imaginary line connecting any fire hydrant with the nearest point on the edge of any carriage way.
