REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE BRITISH GUIANA (REGISTRATION) ORDER, 1964

Under section 2 of the British Guiana (Registration) Order, 1964, the Governor in his discretion has made the following regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Registration (Amendment) (No. 6) Regulations, 1964, and shall be construed and read with the Registration Regulations 1964, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any regulations amending the same.

2. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion after regulation 39 thereof, of the following new regulation —

39 A. (1) Any person whose name appears on a preliminary list who, subsequent to his application for registration, has changed his place of ordinary residence or the place at which under paragraph (6) or (7) of regulation 13 he is deemed to be ordinarily resident, may make application in writing between the 15th day of July 1964 and the 15th day of August 1964 to the registrar of the district in which he is, or can be deemed to be, resident at the time of such application, to transfer his registration from the division in which he was resident to that in which he is, or can be deemed to be, ordinarily resident at that time and such application shall be accompanied by his identity paper; and thereupon the said registrar shall, if he is satisfied that such person has become or can now be deemed ordinarily resident in a division of his district endorse his identity paper accordingly and cause his name and other particulars to be deleted from the preliminary list on which they appear and enter them on the preliminary list or on the part of the register, as the case may be, for the division in which such person is or is deemed to be now ordinarily resident.

(2) Upon the transfer of a registration under paragraph (1) of this regulation, the registrar of the district in which the applicant first resided may, if the circumstances so require, cause to be transferred to the registrar of the district to which the registration is transferred, the duplicate of the relevant identity paper and the original and duplicate of the relevant application for registration.

(3) Notwithstanding the requirement of paragraph (1) of this regulation that an application for transfer of registration shall be accompanied by the identity paper of the person who

makes such application, the registrar shall, if he is satisfied that such identity paper has been lost and if he is further satisfied as to the identity of the person applying to transfer his registration and that such person has become or can be deemed to be ordinarily resident in a division in his district, transfer his registration accordingly”.
