REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939
TO 1964.

UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 TO 1964, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22(1) OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXECISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

Citation and construction.

No. 8 of 1964.

Substitution of new regulation 63A.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (No. 2) Regulations, 1965, and shall be construed and read as one with the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 63A of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted therefor —

“Fines not to be imposed in certain cases. Cap. 15. Cap. 10. No. 29 of 1961.

63A. The provisions of section 36 of the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) Ordinance and the provisions of section 21 of the Criminal Law (Offences) Ordinance (as amended by the Miscellaneous Enactments (Amendment) Ordinance, 1961) shall not apply where a person is convicted of any offence which the Governor by order prescribes to be a specified offence for the purposes of this regulation.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations substitute a new regulation for regulation 63A of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964 (as amended from time to time) so as to revoke those provisions of regulation 63A which restricted the power to grant bail where persons were charged with the commission of certain offences under the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964.
