

CHAPTER 256.

IMPORTATION OF BEES.

REGULATIONS

made by the Governor in Council under section 3 on the 3rd July, 1936. Regs. 3rd July, 1936.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Importation of Bees Regulations. Short title.

2. Without written permission from the Director of Agriculture no person shall import into the Colony any— Importation of certain bees and bee-keepers' stock prohibited without permission.

(a) honey, combs, or

(b) hives and other beekeepers' stock which have previously been in use, or

(c) queen bees, or

(d) worker bees and drone bees in any stage of development.

3. The Director of Agriculture in granting permission to any applicant may limit the number of bees or the quantity of any products or articles mentioned in the last preceding regulation that may be imported by that applicant. Restriction on quantity of bees or bee-keepers' stock to be imported.

4. Queen bees shall be imported in packages addressed to the applicant in care of the Director of Agriculture, Georgetown, and no person shall remove any queen bee from the package or cage in which it has been imported except in accordance with the directions of the Director of Agriculture. Imported packages to be addressed c/o Director of Agriculture and bees not to be removed without permission.

5. Every importation of queen bees shall be made at the importer's risk and no claim for damages or compensation shall be made or be sustainable by him for any deaths or losses of queen bees that may occur in carrying out these regulations. Importation of queen bees at importer's risk.
