THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

(Cap. 51:02)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER
BY SECTION 103 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC
ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

1. These Regulations, which amend the Motor Vehicles ^{Citation.}
and Road Traffic Regulations*, may be cited as the Motor Vehi-
cles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations 1984.

2. Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations is hereby ^{Amendment}
amended by the re-numbering of it as paragraph (1) thereof ^{of regulation}
and by the insertion, after paragraph (1) as so re-numbered, of ^{3 of the}
the following paragraph as paragraph (2) — ^{Principal}
^{Regulations}

“(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph
(1), the different series of identification marks assigned
to the different classes of motor vehicles used by the
Guyana Defence Force (including the People's Militia)
and the Guyana National Service shall begin with the
letters specified below against each class of vehicle —

3. (1) The amendments made by these Regulations to the Principal Regulations shall apply in relation to motor vehicles used by the Guyana Defence Force (including the People's Militia) and the Guyana National Service whether they have been registered before, or are registered after, the commencement of these Regulations.

(2) Where in pursuance of the amendments made to the Principal Regulations by these Regulations it becomes necessary to assign another identification mark for a motor vehicle registered before or after the commencement of these Regulations, the licensing officer may exercise the powers conferred upon him by section 12(2) of the Act.
