REGULATIONS
Made Under
THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT
(Cap. 47:01)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Postal Paid Impression Regulations, and shall come into operation on 1st July, 1983. ^{Citation and commencement.}
- 2. Licences for postal paid impressions shall be issued by the Postmaster General and shall be in the form, and issued subject to the conditions, set out in the Schedule. ^{Form of licence. Schedule.}
- 3. The licensee shall, prior to the issue thereof, pay for a licence, a fee of one hundred and twenty dollars and shall also pay a fee of one hundred and twenty dollars on the 1st January in each year during the continuance of the licence. ^{Fee for licence.}

SCHEDULE

LICENCE TO USE POSTAL PAID IMPRESSION POSTMASTER GENERAL TO GUYANA

TO

Whereas.....
(hereinafter called "the User") has applied to the Postmaster General for a licence to use at the office and for the business of the User at his Head Office ata Postal Paid Impression No..... printed by a printing press or other printing device and date-stamping die or dies as are specified in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of making impressions on postal packets to denote pre-payment of postage to such extent and in such cases as the Postmaster General shall for the time being in writing authorise.

Now, therefore, the Postmaster General in consideration of the payment by the User to the Postmaster General the fee of one hundred and twenty dollars (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged) doth hereby grant to the User licence to use postal paid impression for such purpose as aforesaid subject to the conditions annexed of this licence :

Provided that —

- (a) the Postmaster General may by notice in writing to the User forthwith revoke this licence if there shall be any breach by the User at any time of any of the

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conditions herein contained or in the event of the Postmaster General considering that any postal paid impression has been improperly used or has been used in such a manner as to cause embarrassment or inconvenience to the Postmaster General or any Post Office Officer;

- (b) the Postmaster General may by notice in writing to the User revoke this licence; and
- (c) this licence is subject and without prejudice to any rights which are now or may for the time being be subsisting or claimed or allowed to be subsisting under or by virtue of the Patents and Designs Act.

THE CONDITIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO

1. No postal paid impression shall be used until a licence is granted.
2. Impressions shall be clear, distinct and complete, and shall be made on the actual bill.
3. Impression shall bear the name of the country, office of posting and the indication that postage has been prepaid.
4. The number of bills posted shall not be less than 10,000 a month and shall be arranged for posting with the addresses facing the same way and shall be tied in bundles.
5. Bills in each posting shall bear the same size, shape and weight and shall be accompanied by a posting docket indicating the number of items.
6. Bills shall be handed to a counter officer at the General Post Office in Georgetown. All Bills (other than those redirected after delivery) found in ordinary collections will be liable to be surcharged.
7. Bills shall be printed with the full postage rate for printed papers as at column 2 of the First Schedule to the Rates of Postage (Surface Mail and Fees for Services) Order.*
8. Payment for postings shall be effected through a Deposit Account which shall be reconciled monthly. The limit of the deposit will be approximately one month's postage.
