- 2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "fifty-two thousand eight hundred and fifty" of the words "fifty-three thousand and fifty".
- 3. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "fifty-two thousand eight hundred and fifty" of the words "fifty-three thousand and fifty".
- 4. The schedule to the Principal Ordinance as substituted by section 4 of the Civil List (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and as amended by section 4 of the Civil List (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, is hereby further amended—
  - (a) by the substitution for the figures "1750" appearing against each of the following designations of the figures "1800":—

"The Solicitor General",

"The Commissioner of Lands and Mines",

"The Comptroller of Customs",

"The Postmaster General";

(b) by the substitution for the total "£52,850" of the total "£53,050".

Commencement. 5. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January, 1954.
