AN ORDINANCE to amend the Georgetown Sewerage and Water Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

A.D. 1960.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Sewerage and Water (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Georgetown Sewerage and Water Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Insertion of
section 11A

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after section 11 of the following section—

“Group Pen-
sion Scheme
and Group
Life Plan.

11A. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 11 of this Ordinance, the Commissioners may institute a contributory Group Pension Scheme and Group Life Plan (hereinafter together referred to as the ‘scheme’), for the benefit of their weekly and daily paid employees, and the following provisions shall apply in relation to such scheme—

- (a) every weekly and daily paid employee of the Commissioners who has attained the age of twenty-one years but is under the age of fifty-five years shall join the scheme;
- (b) the Commissioners shall contribute to the scheme in respect of each employee under the scheme, such amount as from time to time constitutes their contribution thereto in accordance with the terms and conditions governing the scheme;
- (c) notwithstanding the provisions of the Labour Ordinance, the Commissioners shall have power to deduct from the wages of every employee under the scheme, such amount as from time to time constitutes the contribution of the employee thereto in accordance with the terms and conditions governing the scheme, and such amount shall be paid into the scheme.

(2) The Commissioners may make rules for the purpose of the administration of the scheme.”
