AN ORDINANCE to confer powers upon and assign duties to, the Deputy Crown Solicitor.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1961.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Deputy Crown Solicitor (Powers) Ordinance, 1961. Short title.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance —

“Deputy Crown Solicitor” means any person appointed by the Governor to the office of Deputy Crown Solicitor or to act in such office.

Powers of
Deputy Crown
Solicitor.

3. The Deputy Crown Solicitor shall have and may exercise and perform all the powers and duties of the Crown Solicitor.
