SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (NO. 1 FOR 2007) BILL 2007

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

SECTION

1. Short title.
2. Issue from the Consolidated Fund authorized.
3. Appropriation.

A BILL
Intituled

AN ACT to provide for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet the expenditure (not otherwise lawfully charged on the Comsolidated Fund) of Guyana for the fiscal year ending 31st December, 2007, estimates whereof have been approved by the National Assembly, and for the appropriation of those sums for the specified purposes, in conformity with the Constitution.

A.D. 2007	Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-
Short title.	1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (No. 1 for 2007) Act 2007.
Issue from the Consolidated Fund authorised. No. 20 of 2003.	2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund of such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate the gross of eight billion, six hundred and seventy-nine million, four hundred and twelve thousand, two hundred and fifty-six dollars (\$8,679,412,256), necessary to meet the expenditure of Guyana for the fiscal year ending on 31 st December, 2007, is hereby authorized in accordance with Article 219 of the Constitution and Sections 24 and 41 of the Fiscal Management and Accountability Act 2003.
Appropriation Schedule.	3. Every sum set out in the Schedule is hereby appropriated for the purposes specified therein with effect from 1 st January, 2007.


