## A BILL Intituled

AN ACT to amend the Land Registry Act.

A.D. 2002

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short title. Cap. 5:02 1. This Act, which amends the Land Registry Act, may be cited as the Land Registry (Amendment) Act 2002.

Amendment of section 37 of the Principal Act.

- 2. Section 37 of the Principal Act is hereby amended in the following respects -
  - (a) by the substitution in subsection (4) for the words "in the Gazette and in one daily newspaper circulating in Guyana" of the words of the words "once in the Gazette and once in each week for three consecutive weeks in each of two daily newspapers circulating in Guyana, the first of three publications in each of the newspapers occurring on the same date as the publication in the Gazette in so far as it is practicable";
  - (b) by the substitution in subsection (5) and (6) for the words "three months" of the words "one month" wherever they occur.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill seeks to amend section 37 (4) of the Land Registry Act, Cap. 5:02, to provide for the registrar on receiving an application for the registration of any land, to ensure a notice thereof to be published once in the Gazette and once in each week for three consecutive weeks in each of two daily newspapers circulating in Guyana.

The Bill also seeks to amend section 37 (5) and (6) of the Act to reduce the period for a notice of objection from three months to one month by any person claiming title to or interest in any land or claiming to be in possession of such land in respect of which an application has been made for the regulation of any public lands.
