AN ACT to effect an alteration to article 142 of the Constitution in accordance with articles 66 and 164 thereof

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Constitution (Amendment) Act 1995.

2. Article 142 of the Constitution is hereby altered in the following respects —

- (a) in paragraph (3), by the insertion of the word "or" at the end of subparagraph (ii) and by the deletion of subparagraph (iia);
- (b) by the deletion of paragraph (4).

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to alter article 142 of the Constitution by deleting paragraph (3) (iia), which was inserted by the Labour (Amendment) Act 1984 (No. 9 of 1984) to provide that wages may, by exception to the protection from deprivation of property by the Constitution, be compulsorily seized without payment of any compensation. It also deletes, from article 142, paragraph (4) thereof which was inserted by the Constitution (Amendment) Act 1988 (No. 1 of 1988), to define regulation of wages to include the reduction of wages.

As a result of the aforesaid amendments article 142 is restored to its original form thus once again affording protection from deprivation of wages without payment of any compensation.
